# <u>Advent 2018</u>

"It just comes around so quickly." I don't know how often I have heard this sentence over the years, and I suppose the older I get, the quicker this time of year comes around. Yes, it's Advent, those four weeks before Christmas, when we concentrate our minds (and hearts) on the Second Coming of Christ at the end of time.

We're in such a 'dizzy' time in our society right now, when adherence to organised religion is very much on the wane, and unfortunately, so is belief in God, that people will tell you they are not sure any more about faith and belief in Jesus Christ, especially true here in the Western world.

But it doesn't really matter though what society thinks, after all, society changes its mindset every generation, because the once-for-all faith of the church (not necessarily the organised one) still stands. Jesus Christ died for the sins of the world, he rose again on the third day and he will return again on the Last Day for his faithful brethren.

This is the truth and this will come to pass, because Jesus Christ is God's answer to the world since the Fall of Man and there is no other answer. He will come on that Day of Days looking for those from the living and the dead who repented of their sin and believed in his holy Gospel of life.

Over and over again in the Gospels and in Paul's letters, we hear the reminder to stay awake and not be deceived. Even in the passage in Luke 21 for the first Sunday of Advent, Jesus himself warns, in verse 34-36, "But watch yourselves lest your hearts be weighed down with dissipation and drunkenness and cares of this life, and that day will come upon you suddenly like a trap. For it will come upon all who dwell on the face of the whole earth. But stay awake at all times, praying that you may have strength to escape all these things that are going to take place, and to stand before the Son of Man." (English Standard Version)

Shouldn't we take Jesus' warning to heart? Repent therefore and believe, lest you perish!
